There are three ways of spelling the sound /sh'n/

To help you choose:

1. The most common way is *tion* ...

...but beware:

2. When a word describes an occupation it is often spelled cian. This usually happens when the root word ends in *ic*, for example:

music > musician

electric > electrician

3. After I, r and s, use **sion**:

excursion

confession

propulsion

4. Now the tricky one! After the letter *n*, some words have *tion* and some have **sion**:

> invention attention mention

pension extension mansion

So ... if you can hear n before sh'n check in a dictionary!
