

Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (objective - overseas)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

objective	An objective is a goal.
obsolete	If something is obsolete , it means it is no longer in use.
obtain	If you obtain something, it means you come into possession of it.
obvious	If something is obvious , it means it is easily seen or understood.
occupational	Occupational means related to the work you were trained to do.
occupy	If you occupy yourself with something, it means you keep yourself busy with it.
occur	Occur is another word for happen.
odd	If something is odd , it means it is unusual or unexpected.
offset	If you offset something, it means you make up for it somewhere else.
ongoing	If something is ongoing , it means it is currently happening.
option	An option is one of a number of things from which only one can be chosen.
orient	If you orient something, it means you determine its position in reference to another point.
orientation	Orientation is the the act of determining one thing's position in reference to another point.
outcome	An outcome is the result of something.
output	An output is signal that comes out of an electronic system.
overall	Overall means 'including everything'.
overlap	Overlap means to extend over or cover a part of something else.
