

## Spelling list: Tier 2 Words (radical - release)

Tier 2 words are less common than high frequency (Tier 1) words. They are often integral to the comprehension of exam questions or core subject knowledge.

radical	If something is <b>radical</b> , it means it is far beyond what is considered the norm.
random	If something is <b>random</b> , it means it lacks any definite plan or order or purpose.
range	A <b>range</b> is a variety of different things or activities.
ratio	A <b>ratio</b> is the relation between things with respect to their comparative quantity, magnitude, or degree.
rational	If an idea is <b>rational</b> , it is consistent with or based on reason.
reaction	A <b>reaction</b> is a process in which one or more substances are changed into others.
recovery	A <b>recovery</b> is the return to an original state of mind or health.
regime	A <b>regime</b> is an authoritarian government.
region	A <b>region</b> is a large indefinite area on the surface of the Earth.
register	A <b>register</b> is an official written record of names, events, or transactions.
regulate	If you <b>regulate</b> something, it means you fix or adjust the time, amount, degree, or rate of it.
regulations	<b>Regulations</b> are authoritative rules.
reinforced	If something has been <b>reinforced</b> , it has been given added strength or support.
rejected	If someone has been <b>rejected</b> , it means they have been turned down.
relaxed	If you are <b>relaxed</b> , it means you are without strain or anxiety.

release

If you **release** something, it means you free it.
