function	<b>Function</b> is another word for job or purpose.
primary	<b>Primary</b> socialisation is when a child under five learns basic skills, values, and norms.
socialisation	Primary <b>socialisation</b> is when a child under five learns basic skills, values, and norms.
nuclear	A <b>nuclear</b> family consists of parents and their children.
family	A nuclear <b>family</b> consists of parents and their children.
extended	An <b>extended</b> family includes other relatives like cousins, grandparents, and aunts and uncles.
lone-parent	A <b>lone-parent</b> family consists of a single parent and their children.
reconstituted	In a <b>reconstituted</b> family, one or both parents might have children from a previous relationship.
diversity	Family <b>diversity</b> is the idea that there are lots of different types of family.
cohabitation	<b>Cohabitation</b> is the act of living with a partner without getting married or having a civil partnership first.
conjugal	A <b>conjugal</b> relationship is a relationship between a married couple, civil partners, or a cohabiting couple.
relationship	A conjugal <b>relationship</b> is a <b>relationship</b> between a married couple, civil partners, or a cohabiting couple.
domestic	The way in which household chores are distributed within a family is known as <b>domestic</b> division of labour.
