print	To <b>print</b> is to transfer an image onto another surface.

relief	<b>Relief</b> artwork is made using multiple layers to create a raised effect.
charcoal	<b>Charcoal</b> is a black drawing material made of carbon.
graphite	<b>Graphite</b> is a metallic grey carbon-based drawing material.
drawing	<b>Drawing</b> is the art of producing images on a surface using ink, pencil, or pen.
painting	<b>Painting</b> is art made by the application of paint to a surface.
sculpture	<b>Sculpture</b> is three-dimensional artwork.
textiles	<b>Textiles</b> is an art form that uses fibres and fabrics.
digital	<b>Digital</b> art is produced with the use of technology.
photography	<b>Photography</b> is an art form based on taking and processing photographs.
ceramic	<b>Ceramic</b> art is made using clay and treated by firing.
movement	A <b>movement</b> is a period of time when a group of artists have a shared philosophy.
graffiti	<b>Graffiti</b> is art created on buildings or in public spaces.
engrave	To <b>engrave</b> is to carve an image or text into a surface.
animation	<b>Animation</b> is the creation of moving images.
mechanical	If something is <b>mechanical</b> , it means it is operated by machine.
