

## Spelling list: Prefixes which change

When adding a prefix you sometimes have to drop or change a letter.

welcome	You are <b>welcome</b> to give him my phone number.
welfare	I care about the <b>welfare</b> of badly treated horses.
always	My shoes are <b>always</b> shiny.
almost	He was <b>almost</b> six feet tall.
although	<b>Although</b> it was raining, the children still wanted to go out to play.
impossible	It's <b>impossible</b> to hear you.
import	Is it against the law to <b>import</b> fresh meat?
impersonate	I will call and <b>impersonate</b> my friend's voice.
illegal	The traffic warden gave me a ticket for <b>illegal</b> parking.
illiterate	An <b>illiterate</b> person cannot read or write.
immature	The behaviour of some children was <b>immature</b> .
irresponsible	It is <b>irresponsible</b> to drive so fast in a town.
irrelevant	The judge said that the evidence was <b>irrelevant</b> .
